Dear Wayne Rodolfich:

I have not heard a response from you in regard to my letter of March 16 requesting the Date, Time, and Place where I can retrieve my phone. Since I am concerned about the safe return of my property, I am making this Demand for Payment. School Policy has damaged me financially in the amount of \$890.45. Therefore, I hereby demand payment of \$890.45 to avoid subjecting our school system to costly litigation. Please refer to the enclosed receipts and Invoice.

I have also reviewed my alleged signature on the 2011-2012 Handbook Receipt of Verification which you sent me and I can tell you that it is not my signature. It was apparently forged. Regardless of that fact, I do not find anything in the Handbook that says you are not responsible for damages caused to me by your Policies. Therefore, I expect your prompt response to compensate me for the damages that I have provided receipts for. Please realize that I have suffered more damage than this Invoice details, but I wish to resolve this matter amicably.

I have provided an Invoice with Net 30 terms, but I plan to file a civil law suit on or about April 2, 2012 unless you notify me beforehand that you plan to pay it. This is because your past behavior leads me to believe that you will not comply. When I file the litigation, I will notify newspapers and TV stations so the public can be aware of your shocking behavior and antiquated Policies. As you are probably already aware, I have setup a Facebook Page for the public to chime in on at <http://www.facebook.com/psdsoundoff> and my own personal web page at <http://primoengineering.com/psd> where I am collecting my documents and correspondence on this matter. Please contact me before April 2, 2012 to avoid all this exposure.

Your Cell Phone Policy states that Student Communication Devices are not allowed on School Property, but the Pascagoula School District (PSD) is not enforcing the policy. As previously pointed out in your March 12 Board Meeting, technology is readily available to detect these devices but the PSD has failed to implement adequate enforcement.

In addition, the PSD has problems with equitable enforcement and I am not being treated as some other Parents have been, who tell me they had their phones returned following confiscation. Also, the PSD does not always confiscate devices when found on Students. My 3 Sons have been in the PSD carrying these devices for at least 5 years. Previous infractions were met with warnings and return of the Devices. When I scolded them for violating the Policy, they insisted that it was a Policy that was not enforced and this fact was confirmed by several of their friends. Therefore I stopped trying to enforce the Policy with them myself. Even your own Board President, Dan Marks, told me the Policy was not widely enforced. Therefore, you have lured the Students into bringing the Devices to School despite the Policy so you can pick and choose who and when to implement enforcement. Since my Device was confiscated, I heard a report from several sources that said a single classroom was screened with a metal detector and 18 such Devices were confiscated. If this is true, it should tell you that your Policy is being grossly violated and under enforced. Once my lawsuit is implemented and the public is made aware, I believe there will be several other Parents who may join in to be compensated as well.

Please provide copies of this letter to all 5 members of the Board of Trustees as well as Principal Boyd West and Teacher Janene Tweatt as they will likely also be named in the suit. Please contact me before April 2, 2012 to avoid all this unnecessary action. It is financially irresponsible for the PSD to spend the thousands of dollars it will incur to fight this.
